# PLAY IDEAS

### Reading tip of the week

Point out words and phrases on shops and signs when you're out and about. Children can recognise familiar words really quickly.

## Writing tip of the week

Use tools such as screwdrivers and spanners to develop hand strength and fine motor skills.

#### **Woodland wonder**

Gather a small collection of items from the natural environment, such as feathers, pine cones, pebbles and leaves. Set your child the challenge of searching the area for the same objects. Have they remembered them all? Can they count how many they found?
