
NURSERY

PLAY IDEAS

Reading tip of the week

Keep some books in the car for your children to look at on journeys or to read to them when waiting in the car. Try listening to audio books on longer journeys. You can borrow audio books from the library.

Writing tip of the week

Give your child empty plastic bottles for them to screw and unscrew the lids. This helps develop fine motor control.

Woodland wonder

Make a woodland crown. Stick double sided sticky tape to a strip of paper and go on an autumnal walk to find some beautiful red, brown, orange and yellow leaves to stick on. Talk about what happens in Autumn to the leaves on trees





Makaton

At nursery each week we introduce a Makaton sign and symbol. These help children communicate their needs and supports spoken language.
