Dear parents and carers,

This week we will carry on with Bonfire and Diwali celebrations, creating firework spinner art pictures and providing classical music for children to mark make to. The conker cafe was very popular last week with lots of children who don't often get involved in home corner type role play enjoying the kitchen being outside, so this week we are adding birdseed for children to use instead of conkers - the sweepings will be undoubtedly enjoyed by both the chickens and wild birds! We have several pairs of diffraction glasses and will also be using coloured acetate to continue an interest in colour and fire!

Children may notice the poppies that have been put up around the village. At nursery, we talk to the children about why we wear poppies at this time of year, we try to answer any questions in a simple and factual way but our underlying message is 'we wear poppies to say thank-you to the soldiers/service people who help to keep us safe'. Depending upon questions, we may expand this, but what we really seek to do is introduce remembrance in a way which our children can understand. We will be visiting the War Memorial on Thursday and will also have paper poppies for children to explore respectfully.

Communication, Language & Literacy:

Try to limit background noise when reading with your child, as it can be distracting. So turn off the TV, music or radio and settle down for a peaceful few moments with a good book.

Create a sensory mark-making bag, this may encourage even a reluctant mark-maker to get involved. Fill a large sealable bag with shaving foam, add food colouring and seal. Your child could make marks with fingers or cotton buds. Experiment with different mark-making tools, and different contents.

Woodland Wonder

Did you know that trees communicate with each other through a fungal network underground? Fungi have fine threads that spread underground called mycelium. They link trees and plants so they can communicate and warn each other of danger, whether they need more nutrients, and older uses can pass nutrients to younger trees and plants that are growing nearby. These partnerships are called mycorrhiza

Makaton

At nursery each week we introduce a Makaton sign and symbol. Makaton supports spoken language and helps children communicate their needs.
