Dear parents and carers,

A member of staff has tested positive for Covid-19, those of us who have been identified as close contacts are daily LFD testing.

Following the recent committee meeting, committee members felt it may be useful for parents to be aware of The Contingency Framework ~ mainly the procedures that may be necessary should the nursery have significant staff shortages.

We aim to keep the nursery open, but to do so safely, we may need to reduce the number of children, which will potentially vary daily. The number of children we can accommodate will be dependent on how many staff are available and the ages and level of need of the priority children. Priority places will be offered in the following order:-

- Vulnerable children including those with additional needs at the discretion of the setting.
- FEET funded children and those in receipt of Early Years Pupil Premium.
- Children of critical workers.
- 3 & 4-year-old children who will be attending school in the next academic year.
- 3-year-old Children.
- 2-year-old Children.

We are fortunate to have not had a surge of cases to date. Your 'not quite 100%' vigilance and continued support in keeping children from 'positive' households at home, is I'm sure a contributory factor.

This week we are going all Winter Olympics! Our Duplo characters have been converted into Olympians for small world snow and ice play, we are being 'creative' with our resources to form Luge, Skeleton and Bobsleigh runs and we'll have a Curling track and scooter slaloms! We will also consider what exercises we need to do to get ready for our own Olympic activities, then for a little bit of R&R, children will be creating a little something to gift to a loved one!




Woodland Wonder:
