Communication, Language & Literacy:

Songs and nursery rhymes help children listen to sounds, words and sentences so that they will start to join in themselves. Repetition is the key to your child being able to join in. Wait at the end of a line or sentence to give your child the chance to join in and fill in the missing word e.g. 'The wheels on the bus go round and round all day' Don't worry if your child doesn't say the word, after a pause say the word for your child, they might be ready to say it next time. (Every Child a Talker)
