Dear parents and carers,

Wow! Well done to Verity, the fundraising committee and the 'Easter Bunnies'. A very well supported fundraising event which (news just in!) raised over £550 for the nursery...fabulous! It was great to see lots of new faces, the children all seemed to be having a lovely time, and the Donkeys were clearly a big hit!

The activities will lead us nicely into our next week and a half of preparing for Easter at the nursery. Hopefully you all know that we have had some chicks hatch. Poppy Chicken was broody and Hilary had some fertile eggs for her to hatch out and be mother hen. We now have three chicks, and hopefully names for them from the name the chicks stall. The children will get to handle the chicks, but we also need to respect mummy hen as she will only let them out of her sight for a few minutes at a time. We do sometimes incubate and hatch ourselves...which does make chick handling easier, but it is more natural (and less time consuming!) to let a mother hen do the rearing and then we can hopefully also integrate the new chicks into our 'flock'.

At nursery this week children will have the opportunity to make Easter cards, make playdough eggs, continue exploring 'collage', go on a shape sorter egg hunt, learn Easter rhymes, and discover some of our egg related mathematical resources. We will also have the Castle and Knights for small world play, and build magnetic play vehicles.
