Dear parents and carers,

It's World Bee Day on Monday 20th May, so this week at nursery we will have lots of bee activity. We have planned some crafting activities, learning about shapes, in particular hexagons, and buzzing about the garden with some Bee focused physical games. We will also continue to plant beans, don't forget to keep the tissue damp and plant out once you have observed the rooting activity! We will be learning how bee's help to make our food by pollinating the flowers of fruits and vegetables. When we return to nursery after half term we will have a minibeast focus. Please note, there will not be a weekly newsletter the week we return.

Please remember we do not apply sun cream unless there is a medical reason to do so. Sun cream should be applied to your child before nursery, if you happen to forget, we should have a pot of cream available outside and please do ask if we happen to forget to put it out. Children should still have waterproof coats for any showery weather, but winter coats will hopefully not be needed for a few months! We do request that children have closed toe footwear, as the weather continues to improve, we do sometimes go barefoot too, which may seem to be an anomaly, but when children are wearing shoes, experience shows us that they tend to perceive their toes are safe when wearing any shoes.
