Dear parents and carers,

Thank you to the parents who were able to support the Village Fete, either by creating the Human Fruit Machine, being part of the machine, or coming to show your support for our community. It was a little damp at times, but still a lovely fun event and the chickens enjoyed the outing!

This weekend is the Mickleham and Westhumble Horticultural Show, which is in the Village Hall and the event we will need homemade cakes for as the Nursery is hosting the cafe. If you are not a cake baker, please do ask a grandparent or offer your time to make teas! The children have been busy making paper plate bees to exhibit in the show. Please come and support the event 2.30pm-4.30pm.

This Wednesday is the end of term show. The show will start at 11.30 and take about half an hour. We still hope it will be outside on the grassy area (despite it thundering as I type!) and will need parent helpers to set up chairs please. As previously mentioned, all children are invited to join, even if they do not normally attend on a Wednesday. These children should arrive at 11.15 toileted and in costume. All younger children are asked to wear plain blues and or whites to look like 'sky' and older children will have a costume in a bag on their peg. Please let us know if your child is NOT attending.

Next weeks sports days ~ our sports days usually start at 11.30 and again last about half an hour. We separated the age groups in covid times and it worked well, hence we continue to operate sports day in this way. Children race in teams and we will release team colours later this week (we occasionally need to make adjustments for sickness etc!)

Younger children's sports day is on Wednesday 17th July: Younger children who do not normally attend on a Wednesday should arrive at nursery wearing a top in their team colour and already toileted at 11.15am. Older Children's Sports day is on Thursday 18th July: Older children who do not normally attend on a Thursday should arrive at nursery wearing a top in their team colour and already toileted at 11.15am. It appears unlikely but should we need to adjust the timings for very hot weather we will advise in the next newsletter. This is the last day of term for our younger children.

Friday 19th July is leavers' party day for children who start school in September. Children may wear fancy dress and we have a bouncy castle and party games planned. Please note drop off is a little later at 9.30a.m. and pick up is at 12.30pm (ish!). The children will have eaten lunch of sausages, peas and our own potatoes, and a cup cake.
