Dear parents and carers,

This week at nursery we will be space 'light'. Not changing our environment significantly, but adding in a few space themed resources as several children have shown an interest in this theme. We'll be singing some space themed rhymes, and you may spot the odd alien!

As you are aware we are already a nut free zone. We now need to add sesame and haricot beans to our restricted foods list.

Snack table:

Due to the shared nature of snacks, items for the snack table **MUST NOT contain NUTS, SESAME or haricot beans**, we can also not offer products labelled with precautionary labelling (e.g may contain traces, not suitable for someone with an allergy to, produced in a factory that also processes etc). Any processed foods MUST be in original packaging.

Lunch boxes:

Lunch box items <u>MUST NOT contain NUTS or SESAME</u>. Precautionary labelled products in original packaging are permitted. There are many very popular foods that do contain sesame e.g. houmous, breadsticks. Please help us by checking ingredients carefully.

The start of a new term is always a busy time, this year particularly so as the Nursery goes through the re-registration process to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. Your Nursery Trustees have been working very hard to carry this process to its fruition, and we are almost there! In the meantime, this does have some impact on normal nursery administration, and in particular the funding system, which has also been updated by Surrey this term. Please be patient whilst we navigate the various challenges.

You can help by ensuring parent documents e.g. admissions forms and funding forms are completed as requested. We will shortly (probably next week!) be sending funding forms home for you to complete!...Oh!! and labelling children's outer clothing and footwear does prevent daily frustrations!!
