Dear parents and carers,

Wow! We have an amazing Pumpkin, donated by a green fingered parent, which we are going to use this week as a base for creating playdough characters - like pumpkin carving, but without the knives! We will also be using the lovely conkers for a maths table activity and for creating conker critters or conker vehicles. Keep those conkers coming in, as we might be able to make conker soap next week too! Children will be able to use some of our construction resources to make Halloween houses and - following a weekend of bonfire building in Westhumble - we will have the play farm out with tractors and mini twigs /branches, to re-create what some children have been playing at the weekend. Did you know that children can have an eyesight test at any age? They do not need to be able to read, or even speak! Most parents will take children to visit the dentist in their preschool years, but many do not realise an eyesight test can also be valuable at this age. Optometrists are recommending eyesight tests for children from the age of three, they will also be able to advise on how much screen time a child should be limited to on a daily basis. An eyesight test is particularly important if there's a history of childhood eye problems, such as a squint or lazy eye in your family.

Getting ready for mark-making!
