Dear parents and carers,

More Christmas activities this week - gluing, sticking and sparkles! Hopefully you are starting to hear some Christmas songs being sung at home too, the children are learning them super quickly!

Just some advice regarding clothing and footwear in cold weather as we had several children last week that found the cold weather especially challenging. We can manage cold weather when we are dressed appropriately and if you are unsure, below are some good tips that work in our environment.

- Good quality base layers ~ a thermal long sleeve top and long johns too if it is especially cold. Shops like Mountain Warehouse sell these very reasonably. Tights will also help if you can't get long johns to fit.
- Warm trousers fleecy ones like jogging trousers or tracksuit bottoms. Avoid skinny denim type trousers!
- A long-sleeved T-shirt or thinner top.
- A fleece type sweater (preferably one that zips up) or similar warm jumper that is not too bulky.
- Socks a thin "normal" pair and then a thick pair of ski, thermal or woolly socks. Please ensure that wellies are roomy enough to accommodate a thicker sock. If they are too tight, feet will still get cold.
- Fleece lined dungaree type waterproof trousers and warm waterproof coat ~ Lidl ones are excellent and reasonably priced.
- Bulk pack of woolly type mittens. Mittens are generally better as fingers can still move in them...bulky fingered gloves are difficult to put on and children tend not to be able to use their fingers to pick anything up when wearing them! The bulk pack is for spares when they get wet and/or lost!
- A tubular scarf or neck snood rather than a long scarf that needs tying.
- A woolly/fleece lined hat that your child is expected to wear when they go out with you too!
- Footwear ~ an investment in a pair of neoprene wellies is a good one! They last three seasons and keep feet warmer in cold weather and feet don't seem to get hot in warmer weather. Snow boots, but only invest if you will use them for playing at home too.
- A smear of vaseline or similar on cheeks will help prevent cold chaffed soreness!
- Excessive bulk may also mean you have a cold child. If clothing is too bulky it will restrict movement and prevent your child from managing to keep themselves warm.

We absolutely suggest Lidl, vinted, charity shops, Mountain Warehouse or similar and re-named hand me downs, however the following are some companies that are recommended for Forest School gear and may be worth a look with Black Friday deals: <u>The Warm Welly Company</u>; <u>Happy Little Soles</u>; <u>Heat Holders</u>; <u>Didriksons</u>

If your child comes to nursery wearing wellies, please remember to provide normal footwear for when we are in the nursery building.

We have several bags of leaves ~ would anyone be able to take them to re-cycle or add to their own household brown bin? We are running short of logs in Forest School, an adult proficient with an axe could help by splitting some of our bigger ones?



You can make the chain as long as you would like to fit the tree, or make shorter dangly decorations to hang from the branches.
