This week at nursery we will continue to learn about and explore the rich resources celebrating Chinese New Year. #### Communication, Language and Literacy:

Songs and nursery rhymes can play an important role in your child's language development. Repetition is the key to your child being able to join in...pause at the end of a line or sentence to give them the chance to join in and fill in the missing word e.g. 'The wheels on the bus go round and round all day ...' Don't worry if your child doesn't do so, after a pause say the word for your child, they might be ready to join in next time.

#### Woodland Wonder:

Last week at nursery some of the children were taking part in some birdwatching in the garden, using tick sheets, learning bird names and listening for different bird calls. Did you take part in the <u>RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch</u> this weekend?

Blue tits are particularly busy in February searching for safe, warm sites ready for building a nest (they like to be organised!). In fact, they are the garden bird species most likely to use nest boxes so if you've been thinking about putting one up... now is the time!
