Dear parents and carers,

We hope you have all had a lovely Easter and made the most of the generally lovely weather!

This week at nursery, we will be reflecting on Easter celebrations and also using the story of St. George to inspire some of our activities. We will use feathers and buttons to create patterns on (pretend) chickens, have size ordering eggs and we have two lovely castles with knights and princesses for small world fantasy play, plus the dressing up resources for this to develop into role play. Children can use resources for creating simple sound shakers, to either use for singing or to scare away any dragons! In the afternoons, we will be 'table painting', testing and deciding on what shapes and marks to use for a printed dragon. The tadpoles have grown significantly, no back legs yet, but they are so huge they must be almost at their next developmental stage! I'm sure the children will be marvelling at their growth!

We have a new staff member, Aimee, who joins us this week. Aimee is our new SENCO and starts on Wednesday. Welcome Aimee. Unless it is cancelled again, Hilary is away from Wednesday for at least two weeks.

Communication & Language:


With St. George's Day fast approaching (23rd April), spark your child's imagination and growing vocabulary by designing your very own dragon!

- Texture Is its skin scaly, smooth, fluffy, or spiky?
- Smell Does it smell smoky, sweet like flowers, or like the sea?
- Features How many wings does it have? Does it breathe fire, ice, or bubbles? Does it have horns, a long tail, or sparkling eyes?
