Child pick up: Lots of settings will have slightly different policies for pick-up/collection. At the nursery, if children are being collected by someone other than their 'joint responsibility' parent, we must have advance notification. This can be in writing on the child's admission form, a note signed by a parent, by email, notified by the adult dropping off the child, or a parent phone call on the day. We do understand that on occasion, a parent will have forgotten to inform us, or indeed the staff member on the door may not have noted a change. However, it is a policy to keep your child safe, so please be patient while we go through the checking process.

#### **Understanding the World:**

This week will be all about pirates...and every pirate needs a map!

You could create a simple map of your home or garden for your child to follow and find hidden 'treasure', using landmarks and prepositional language to help them to understand and follow. Your child may also enjoy making a treasure map of their own for you to follow, or creating a map of an imaginary treasure island!



## Number of the week:



### **Woodland Wonder:**

Every year in early summer, <u>stag beetles</u> emerge to find mates. They spend the first five to seven years of their life underground as larvae and have just a few short weeks to live as adults.

Stag beetle numbers have declined drastically over the past few decades and the species is seriously endangered. If you see one on a pavement, please move it out of harm's way. Despite being large, they are placid and harmless provided you don't stick a finger between the male's large 'antlers', which can inflict quite a strong pinch. Pick them up gently with finger and thumb on either side of the thorax (the middle part of the body, behind the head) and move them into a garden or similar.

The best time to spot a stage beetle is early evening, flying in an upright and rather ungainly style, making a noise like a small fighter plane! They tend to make a pretty uncontrolled landing, often ending up on pavements, which is where you're most likely to see them and where they need your help to get to safety.
