Dear parents and carers,

This week we will be continuing with our pirate theme.. because we Arrrgh!

The children have really enjoyed swashbuckling adventures, and last weeks hot weather lent itself to lots of water play. This week is not supposed to be quite as hot, but we have lots of water play activities again, so please do remember to pack spare clothing.

We will also be thinking about assigning roles for our gingerbread man play which is NEXT FRIDAY 4th July. All children are invited to participate. Those who do not usually attend on a Friday should arrive in costume and toileted at 11.15. The play will start at about 11.30 and takes about half an hour. Please remember to apply sun cream before your child comes to nursery, and provide named sun hats. We are lucky to have a mainly shaded garden, but some areas are little sun traps and we want to keep your children sun safe. We offer a water station in warmer weather and encourage children to drink plenty.

Mathematics:


The power of puzzles!
