Dear parents and carers,

This week at nursery, we are continuing to explore the fruits of autumn with some conker counting, vegetable printing and learning a new song using a pumpkin!

We will also have some Halloween-type activities, bug hunting in a cauldron, creating a spider's web with string, pretending our space hoppers are bouncing pumpkins and we will have our dark den with torches!

The autumn air is starting to increase the number of coughs and colds. At nursery we teach children to cough into their elbow and we support nose wiping/blowing into tissues too. Children then either wash their hands or use antibacterial foam. You may like to use our nursery handwashing song at home too! Sung to the tune of Frere Jacques:-

With seasonal illnesses in mind, parents of 2- and 3-year-olds can now get their child's free flu nasal spray not just at their GP practice, but also at local pharmacies that offer the service. This safe, painless nasal spray is a simple way to help protect your child from flu and serious complications like bronchitis and pneumonia. It also helps protect vulnerable family members and reduces the chance of you needing to take time off work due to illness.
