Dear parents and carers,

This week at nursery we will continue with Halloween-type activities, and will be using Walter's web and Spiderella as two of our learning through stories. Walter's web is about shape, and Spiderella, counting. Our activities will have a shape and counting focus, and children will have lots of opportunities to explore both. We will also have fun activities to continue to develop fine motor skills, Halloween slime and hammering into pumpkins.

We will also be learning the story of Diwali. A traditional tale about Prince Rama and Princess Sita. There is a monster-type character in the story (he does have 10 heads, which is also good for counting!) but like all traditional tales, he has an unfortunate end! Diwali is a celebration of light and of good over evil.

We just wanted to make a note about waterproof trousers/suits/dungarees (the latter being our preferred option, because you don't have to wear a coat and they prevent the bending down chill gap you can get with trousers!). We collectively have years of experience of various outfits and felt it could be beneficial to share some of our conclusions with you!

Waterproofs should comfortably fit OVER the top of Wellingtons. If it is raining, and waterproofs do not fit over the top of Wellingtons, or ride up as soon as any climbing is attempted...the rain ends up inside the welly! At nursery, we don't use underfoot stirrup straps because anything unpleasant that has been trodden in, is not so easily washed off an elastic strap as it would be off a Wellington boot. We do recognise that some nurseries provide the preferred waterproofs for children to wear. However, we do not have a laundry on-site, and none of us are particularly keen on taking multiple outfits to launder in our own homes! Please take the opportunity in half term to check your child's waterproofs are fit for purpose. Lidl waterproof dungarees are perfect and good value for money. They sell lined and unlined ones, which cover all seasons. We have also noted M&S supply well-fitting and good quality waterproof dungarees (but as with the Lidl ones, suggest the dreaded stirrup strap is cut off).
